- (i) On or before December 15 of each year, the Commission shall submit a report on its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, to the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Health and Government Operations Committee.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2002. It shall remain effective for a period of [8] 10 years and, at the end of May 31, [2010] 2012, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

- 16 (a) The Statewide Advisory Commission on Immunizations shall study the safety of the human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine.
 - (b) As part of its study, the Commission shall:
- 19 (1) review the medical literature regarding the safety of the HPV 20 vaccine;
- 21 (2) review all information available from the federal Centers for 22 Disease Control and Prevention and Food and Drug Administration regarding the 23 safety of the HPV vaccine, including information reported through the Vaccine 24 Adverse Event Reporting System, the Vaccine Safety Datalink Project, and the 25 Clinical Immunization Safety Assessment Network;
- 26 (3) review the information that health care providers communicate to 27 their patients and family members of patients regarding the benefits and risks of the 28 HPV vaccine; and
- 29 (4) hold at least two public hearings, advertised to the public, on the 30 safety of the HPV vaccine, during which members of the public each receive a 31 reasonable amount of time to adequately describe their experience with and 32 perspective on the HPV vaccine.
- 33 (c) (1) Based on its study, the Commission shall determine whether there 34 is a need for better information or better communication of information on the safety 35 of the HPV vaccine.
