25	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

4 5 6 7	(b) "Abatement" means a set of measures designed to eliminate or reduce lead—based paint hazards in residential, public, or commercial buildings, bridges, or other structures or superstructures in accordance with standards established by the Department which may include:
8 9 10 11	(1) The removal of lead-based paint and lead-contaminated dust, the containment or encapsulation of lead-based paint, the replacement or demolition of lead-painted surfaces or fixtures, and the removal or covering of lead-contaminated soil; and
12 13	(2) All preparation, cleanup, disposal, and postabatement clearance testing activities associated with these measures.
14 15 16	(C) (1) "INTERIM CONTROL" MEANS A MEASURE DESIGNED TO TEMPORARILY REDUCE HUMAN EXPOSURE OR THE LIKELIHOOD OF HUMAN EXPOSURE TO LEAD-BASED PAINT HAZARDS.
17	(2) AN INTERIM CONTROL INCLUDES:
18	(I) SPECIALIZED CLEANING;
19	(II) REPAIR;
20	(III) MAINTENANCE;
21	(IV) PAINTING;
22	(V) TEMPORARY CONTAINMENT;
23	(VI) MONITORING; AND
24 25	(VII) ANY OTHER ACTIVITY SPECIFIED BY THE DEPARTMENT IN REGULATION.
26	[(c)] (D) "Lead containing substance" means:
27 28	(1) Any paint, plaster, or surface encapsulation material containing more than 0.50 percent lead by weight calculated as lead metal in the dried solid or

3 4	(2) Such other standards consistent with an applicable federal definition as the Department may set by regulation.
5 6	[(d)] (E) "Person" includes any public or municipal corporation, or any agency, bureau, department, or instrumentality of federal, State, or local government.
7 8	[(e)] (F) "Provide lead paint abatement services" means to engage in the risk assessment, inspection, or abatement of lead-containing substances.
9 10 11	(G) (1) "RENOVATION" MEANS THE MODIFICATION OF AN EXISTING STRUCTURE, OR PORTION OF A STRUCTURE, THAT RESULTS IN THE DISTURBANCE OF A PAINTED SURFACE.
12	(2) "RENOVATION" INCLUDES:
13 14	(I) THE REMOVAL, MODIFICATION, OR REPAIR OF A PAINTED SURFACE OR PAINTED COMPONENT;
15	(II) THE REMOVAL OF A BUILDING COMPONENT;
16	(III) A WEATHERIZATION PROJECT;
17 18	(IV) AN INTERIM CONTROL THAT DISTURBS A PAINTED SURFACE; OR
19 20	(V) ANY OTHER ACTIVITY SPECIFIED BY THE DEPARTMENT IN REGULATION.
21 22	(H) (1) "TARGET BUILDING" MEANS A BUILDING CONSTRUCTED BEFORE 1978.

4 5 6 7	(A) THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBTITLE DO NOT APPLY TO A RENOVATION ACTIVITY OR TARGET BUILDING THAT HAS BEEN EXEMPTED BY THE DEPARTMENT BY THE ADOPTION OF REGULATIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 6–1002.1(B)(1) OF THIS SUBTITLE.
8 9	[(a)] (B) Except as provided in subsection [(c)] (D) of this section, unless the person is accredited by the Department under this subtitle, a person may not:
10 11	(1) Act as a contractor or supervisor for the purpose of providing lead paint abatement services;
12 13	(2) Provide training to others who provide lead paint abatement services; or
14	(3) Engage in the inspection of lead-based paint hazards.
15 16 17	[(b)] (C) The Department shall, by regulation, create exceptions to the accreditation requirement for instances where the disturbance of lead—containing substance is incidental.
18 19	[(c)] (D) An individual who acts only as a worker or project designer need not be accredited, but must be trained.

21 22	(A) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE PERFORMANCE OF RENOVATION IN A TARGET BUILDING.
23	(B) REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION MAY INCLUDE:
24 25	(1) EXEMPTIONS FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBTITLE FOR SPECIFIC TYPES OF RENOVATION ACTIVITIES OR TARGET BUILDINGS;

11 12 13	(a) [The] EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN § 6–1002.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE Department shall adopt regulations to carry out the provisions of this subtitle.
14	(b) Regulations adopted under this subtitle may include:
15 16	(1) Initial and continuing standards and procedures for accreditation, including education, training, examination, and job performance standards;
17	(2) Standards and procedures for renewal of accreditation;
18 19	(3) Standards and procedures for modification, suspension, or revocation of accreditation;
20 21	(4) Different standards and procedures for different lead paint abatement services;
22 23	(5) Recognition of accreditation or similar approvals of persons by other governmental entities; and
24 25	(6) Such other provisions as may be necessary to effectuate the purposes of this subtitle.
26 27 28	(c) The Department shall review and revise its certification and other regulations under this subtitle as necessary to ensure continued eligibility for federal funding of lead–hazard activities in the State.

(d) The Department shall set reasonable fees for the accreditation of persons who provide lead paint abatement, RENOVATION, OR RENOVATION TRAINING

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- 1 services sufficient to cover the Department's direct and indirect costs of administering 2 this subtitle. 3 6-1004.There is a Lead Accreditation Fund. 4 (a) All fees collected under [§ 6–1003(d)] §§ 6–1002.1(B)(7) AND 5 (b) (1) 6 6-1003(D) OF THIS SUBTITLE and fines and penalties imposed under § 6-1005 of 7 this subtitle shall be deposited in the Lead Accreditation Fund. 8 The Department may apply for and accept any funds or grants 9 from any federal, State, local, or private source for credit to the Fund that might assist 10 with development, establishment, administration, and education and enforcement activities of the lead paint abatement AND RENOVATION services accreditation 11 12 [program] PROGRAMS under this subtitle. 13 The Department shall use the Lead Accreditation Fund for activities by 14 the Department that are related to processing, monitoring and regulating the 15 accreditation of lead paint abatement AND RENOVATION services, and for program 16 development of these activities. 17 The Lead Accreditation Fund shall be a continuing, nonlapsing (1) special fund, and is not subject to § 7-302 of the State Finance and Procurement 18 19 Article. 20 (2)The State Treasurer shall hold and the State Comptroller shall 21account for the Accreditation Fund. 22 The Accreditation Fund shall be invested and reinvested. Any 23investment earnings shall be paid into the Accreditation Fund. 246-1005.25 Except as otherwise provided, the provisions and procedures of §§ 6-420 26 through 6-422 of this title and § 7-266(b) of this article shall be used and shall apply to enforce violations of: 2728(1) This subtitle; 29 (2) Any regulations adopted under this subtitle; and 30 Any condition of accreditation issued under this subtitle.
