# A BILL ENTITLED

### 1 AN ACT concerning

## State Police Retirement System – Special Disability Retirees – Reemployment

- 4 FOR the purpose of providing that only certain disability retirees of the State Police  $\mathbf{5}$ Retirement System are exempt from a temporary suspension of their disability 6 retirement allowance under certain circumstances; prohibiting certain disability 7 retirees of the State Police Retirement System from being rehired by certain 8 employers in certain positions; requiring the Secretary of State Police to provide 9 the Board of Trustees of the State Retirement and Pension System with certain information; providing for a temporary suspension of benefits paid to certain 10 disability retirees under certain circumstances within a certain period of time; 11 12providing for the resumption of disability benefits with certain adjustments to the benefits after receipt by the Board of Trustees of certain documentation 13 from the Secretary of State Police; and generally relating to the reemployment 14of special disability retirees of the State Police Retirement System. 15

- 26 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 27 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 (2) A retiree whose allowance is temporarily suspended under this 2 subsection is not subject to a reduction as provided in § 29–116 of this subtitle during 3 the period of employment by a participating employer.

4 (3) Upon receiving satisfactory documentation that the retiree is no 5 longer employed by a participating employer, the Board of Trustees shall reinstate the 6 retiree's allowance with accumulated cost-of-living adjustments from the date the 7 allowance was temporarily suspended.

8 (4) The retiree's allowance will be reinstated on the first day of the 9 month following the month in which the retiree ceased employment with the 10 participating employer.

12 (A) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO A DISABILITY RETIREE OF THE STATE 13 POLICE RETIREMENT SYSTEM WHO IS RECEIVING A SPECIAL DISABILITY 14 RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE UNDER § 29–111 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

15 (B) A DISABILITY RETIREE DESCRIBED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS 16 SECTION MAY NOT BE REEMPLOYED BY A PARTICIPATING EMPLOYER OF THE 17 STATE OR ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE IN A POSITION IN WHICH 18 THE DISABILITY RETIREE, IN AN OFFICIAL CAPACITY, IS AUTHORIZED BY LAW 19 TO MAKE ARRESTS.

(c) THE SECRETARY OF STATE POLICE SHALL REPORT TO THE BOARD
OF TRUSTEES ANY DISABILITY RETIREE DESCRIBED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF
THIS SECTION WHO IS REEMPLOYED BY A PARTICIPATING EMPLOYER OF THE
STATE OR ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE IN A POSITION WHERE
THE DISABILITY RETIREE, IN AN OFFICIAL CAPACITY, IS AUTHORIZED BY LAW
TO MAKE ARRESTS.

26 (D) (1) WITHIN 30 DAYS OF RECEIVING NOTICE FROM THE 27 SECRETARY OF STATE POLICE AS PROVIDED UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS 28 SECTION, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL, AFTER GIVING NOTICE TO THE 29 DISABILITY RETIREE, TEMPORARILY SUSPEND THE RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE 30 OF THE DISABILITY RETIREE.

31(2) AFTER THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES HAS RECEIVED 32SATISFACTORY DOCUMENTATION FROM THE SECRETARY OF STATE POLICE 33 THAT THE DISABILITY RETIREE IS NO LONGER EMPLOYED BY A PARTICIPATING 34EMPLOYER OF THE STATE OR ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE IN A POSITION WHERE THE DISABILITY RETIREE, IN AN OFFICIAL CAPACITY, IS 35AUTHORIZED BY LAW TO MAKE ARRESTS, THE BOARD SHALL REINSTATE THE 36

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1 DISABILITY RETIREE'S ALLOWANCE WITH ACCUMULATED COST-OF-LIVING 2 ADJUSTMENTS FROM THE DATE THE ALLOWANCE WAS TEMPORARILY 3 SUSPENDED.

4 (3) THE RETIREE'S ALLOWANCE SHALL BE REINSTATED ON THE 5 FIRST DAY OF THE MONTH FOLLOWING THE MONTH IN WHICH THE DISABILITY 6 RETIREE CEASED EMPLOYMENT BY A PARTICIPATING EMPLOYER OF THE STATE 7 OR ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE IN A POSITION IN WHICH THE 8 DISABILITY RETIREE, IN AN OFFICIAL CAPACITY, IS AUTHORIZED BY LAW TO 9 MAKE ARRESTS.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 11 July 1, 2010.

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
