15	(a) In this section, "abandoned vessel" means any vessel that:
$16\\17$	 Is left illegally or has remained without permission for more than 30 days on public property, including public marinas, docks, or boatyards;
$\frac{18}{19}$	(2) Has remained at the following locations for more than [90] 30 days without the consent of the owner or person in control of the property:
20	(i) A private marina or property operated by a private marina;
$\frac{21}{22}$	(ii) A private boatyard or property operated by a private boatyard;
