BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Chapter 438 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2008 Section 1 and 2 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Chapter 439 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2008 Section 1 and 2 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
