## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Prince George's County – Maryland Department of Transportation – Study of
Rail Transit System for Southern Prince George's County

5 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Department of Transportation to conduct 6 a study to determine the technical feasibility and economic viability of 7 constructing a Metro rail, light rail, or monorail transit system in southern 8 Prince George's County in the MD 201/I-295 corridor, from Indian Head to 9 certain Metro rail stations near the border of the District of Columbia; requiring the Department to solicit input from certain persons as it conducts the study; 10 requiring the Department to report its findings and recommendations to the 11 12 Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; requiring the 13 Department to comply with this Act using existing resources; providing for the 14 termination of this Act; and generally relating to a study by the Maryland 15 Department of Transportation regarding a rail transit system for southern Prince George's County. 16

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That:

- (a) The Maryland Department of Transportation shall undertake a study to assess the technical feasibility and economic viability of constructing a Metro rail, light rail, or monorail transit system in southern Prince George's County in the MD 201/I–295 corridor from Indian Head, Maryland, to either the Southern Avenue or the Anacostia Metro station near the border of Washington, D.C., including:
- (1) identifying property that would be needed to construct an appropriate rail transit system in the designated corridor and determining the ownership of the property involved:



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- 1 (2) evaluating any property identified in the corridor as a potential site for a rail station as to its adequacy for parking, both at the time rail service would be initiated and at a later date for parking expansion;
- 4 (3) estimating the cost to the State and applicable local governments to purchase rights—of—way needed for the project to proceed; and
- 6 (4) determining the feasibility of using a portion of any existing public 7 right—of—way for the project.
- 8 (b) The Department shall solicit input for the study from affected and 9 interested persons throughout the State, including:
- 10 (1) the county and municipal governing bodies in the affected corridor, 11 especially in Prince George's County and in other southern Maryland jurisdictions;
- 12 (2) citizens throughout the Washington, D.C., metropolitan and 13 Baltimore metropolitan areas who utilize mass transit services or are otherwise 14 interested in the availability of mass transit services;
- 15 (3) utility companies that currently own or use rights-of-way that 16 may be suitable for mass transit; and
- 17 (4) other members of the public.
- 18 (c) On or before February 1, 2011, the Maryland Department of 19 Transportation shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in 20 accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Maryland Department of Transportation shall use existing resources to conduct the study and make findings and recommendations as specified under Section 1 of this Act.
  - SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2010. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 2011, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
