13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

8 (2) The Committee shall review the adequacy and appropriateness of 9 all benefits specified in §§ 9–626 and 9–627(a) and (b) of the Labor and Employment 10 Article and make recommendations for necessary changes prior to the 1992 Regular 11 Session of the General Assembly.

12 (3) The Committee shall direct the Insurance Commissioner to 13 prepare a feasibility study on alternative methods to determine the provision for claim 14 payment and to submit the study to the Governor and the Legislative Policy 15 Committee on or before January 1, 1991.

16 (f) The Insurance Commissioner and the Workers' Compensation 17 Commission shall:

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- (1) cooperate fully with the Committee;

19 (2) keep the Committee fully informed as to the condition of workers' 20 compensation benefits and workers' compensation insurance in the State and the 21 effect of Chapters 590 and 591 of the Laws of Maryland of 1987 on those benefits and 22 that insurance; and

(3) submit an annual report, subject to § 2–1246 of this title, to the
Committee on or before October 1 of each year that incorporates the information
described in paragraph (2) of this subsection.

26 (g) The Committee shall report to the Governor and the Legislative Policy27 Committee on December 31 of each year.

 29 October 1, 2010.
