WHENEVER THE STATE HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION PLACES A 1 **(B)** $\mathbf{2}$ TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICE ON A HIGHWAY DESIGNATING DESIGNATES A 3 PORTION OF THE A HIGHWAY AS AN HOV LANE, THE TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICE SHALL ALSO INDICATE THAT THE HOV LANE MAY BE USED AT ALL TIMES BY 4 $\mathbf{5}$ THAT HAVE OBTAINED Α PERMIT PLUG-IN VEHICLES FROM THE 6 ADMINISTRATION UNDER THIS SECTION, REGARDLESS OF THE NUMBER OF 7PASSENGERS IN THE VEHICLE.

JANUARY 1 OF 21**(**D**) B**¥ ON OR BEFORE EACH YEAR, THE ADMINISTRATION AND THE STATE HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION JOINTLY SHALL 2223REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE EFFECT 24THAT THE USE OF HOV LANES BY PLUG-IN VEHICLES HAS ON THE OPERATION 25OF THE HOV LANES OF THE USE OF THE PLUG-IN VEHICLE PERMITS ISSUED 2627UNDER THIS SECTION ON THE OPERATION OF HOV LANES IN THE STATE.

28 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 29 October 1, 2010. It shall remain effective for a period <u>of</u> \ge <u>3</u> years and, at the end of 30 September 30, $\frac{2012}{2013}$, with no further action required by the General Assembly, 31 this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
