A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Public Health - Nontobacco Nicotine Products

- FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from selling, distributing, or offering for sale certain products that contain or deliver nicotine for human consumption; making the violation of a certain provision of law a misdemeanor subject to a certain fine; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to nontobacco nicotine products.

- WHEREAS, The marketing and sale of nontobacco products containing nicotine can help introduce youth to the use of tobacco products, which has a high probability of resulting in nicotine addiction; and
- WHEREAS, These negative effects are especially pronounced because current marketing practice often results in flavors being added to the products, which further attracts youth; and
- WHEREAS, Maryland can take direct action to prevent or reduce the negative health implications caused by the introduction of new nicotine products and the accompanying marketing that targets the products to our youth; now, therefore,
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:



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Article - Health - General

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- 3 (A) This section does not apply to a tobacco product that is 4 regulated under Title 16 of the Business Regulation Article.
- 5 (B) A PERSON MAY NOT SELL, DISTRIBUTE, OR OFFER FOR SALE A PRODUCT, OR ANY PART OF A PRODUCT, THAT:
- 7 (1) CONTAINS OR DELIVERS NICOTINE INTENDED FOR HUMAN 8 CONSUMPTION; AND
- 9 (2) HAS NOT BEEN APPROVED BY THE UNITED STATES FOOD AND 10 DRUG ADMINISTRATION.
- 11 (C) A PERSON THAT VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A
 12 MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING
 13 \$1,000 FOR EACH VIOLATION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2010.
