4 (1) IS OPERATED **PRIMARILY** <u>SOLELY</u> IN SUPPORT OF A 5 CORPORATE OR ANY OTHER HEADQUARTERS, TRAINING, CONFERENCE, OR 6 AWARDS FACILITY OR CAMPUS;

7(2) PROVIDES LODGING PREDOMINANTLYSOLELYFOR8EMPLOYEES, CONTRACTORS, VENDORS, AND OTHER INVITEESOFTHE9CORPORATION THAT OWNS THE DORMITORY OR LODGING FACILITY; AND

10(3) DOES NOT OFFER LODGING SERVICES TO THE GENERAL11PUBLIC.
