- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene, in 5 consultation with Med Chi, the Maryland State Medical Society, to appoint the 6 chair of the Statewide Advisory Commission on Immunizations; establishing the 7 terms of the members of the Commission; repealing a provision that requires 8 the Commission to study and make recommendations about immunizations 9 required by children entering schools in times of vaccine shortage; requiring the Commission to study and make recommendations about a public campaign in 10 the event of a public health emergency involving immunizations; making 11 12certain technical corrections; repealing a certain termination provision; and 13 generally relating to the Statewide Advisory Commission on Immunizations.
