16 Preamble

WHEREAS, Baltimore County comprises people from many ethnic, cultural, and linguistic backgrounds, all of whom have contributed to this county the richness of their heritages; and

WHEREAS, Baltimore County has been greatly enriched by this diversity, and the government should always take steps to promote the dignity of all the heritages that form this county's pluralistic society; and

WHEREAS, It is not the purpose of this Act nor may this Act be construed to infringe on the rights of citizens to exercise the use of a language of their choice for private conduct; now, therefore,

(C) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION, THE COUNTY AGENCIES AND FUNCTIONS SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION SHALL:
(1) WRITE AND PUBLISH EACH OFFICIAL DOCUMENT IN ENGLISH AND
(2) CONDUCT EACH MEETING AND OTHER OFFICIAL ORAL COMMUNICATION THE AGENCIES AUTHORIZE IN ENGLISH.
(D) THE COUNTY AGENCIES AND FUNCTIONS SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION MAY CONDUCT AFFAIRS IN A LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH TO:
(1) COMPLY WITH FEDERAL LAW;
(2) PROTECT PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY;
(3) PROTECT THE RIGHTS OF CIVIL LITIGANTS, CRIMINAL DEFENDANTS, OR VICTIMS OF CRIME;
(4) ASSIST STUDENTS WHO ARE NOT PROFICIENT IN THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE BY PROVIDING ENGLISH INSTRUCTION TO FACILITATE AS RAPIDLY AS POSSIBLE A TRANSITION TO THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE;
(5) PROVIDE INTERPRETATION FOR DEAF INDIVIDUALS IN AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE;
(6) TEACH A FOREIGN LANGUAGE;
(7) PROMOTE THE ARTS, INTERNATIONAL COMMERCE, OR TOURISM; OR
(8) Assist individuals who are not proficient in English in the conduct of governmental affairs.
(E) THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO REQUIRE THE TRANSLATION INTO ENGLISH OF ANY OFFICIAL MOTTO OR SLOGAN.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if any provision of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any reason in a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or any other application of this Act which can be given effect without the

- 1 invalid provision or application, and for this purpose the provisions of this Act are
- 2 declared severable.
- 3 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 4 October 1, 2010.
