2	Civil Actions – Transmission of Altered Electronic Mail

3 FOR the purpose of providing that a person who receives a communication through electronic mail and, after altering the communication, transmits the 4 5 communication through electronic mail to a third party with the intent to 6 defame, defraud, or otherwise harm the author of the communication is liable to 7 the author in a civil action for certain damages; providing that a person entitled 8 to bring an action under this Act may recover certain damages; authorizing a 9 court to award reasonable attorney's fees to a person who is awarded damages 10 under this Act; and generally relating to civil actions and electronic mail.

 7 MAY RECOVER ECONOMIC DAMAGES AND ANY OTHER PECUNIARY LOSS
 8 SUSTAINED BY THE PERSON THAT WERE PROXIMATELY CAUSED BY THE
- 9 TRANSMISSION OF THE ALTERED ELECTRONIC MAIL.
- 10 (B) IF A PERSON IS AWARDED DAMAGES UNDER THIS SUBTITLE, THE 11 COURT MAY ALSO AWARD REASONABLE ATTORNEY'S FEES.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2010.
