# State Retirement and Pension System – Retiree Organizations Organization Direct Mailings

FOR the purpose of providing that <u>a</u> certain retiree <del>organizations</del> <u>organization</u> may 4  $\mathbf{5}$ make a certain number of annual requests during a certain period of time to the 6 Board of Trustees of the State Retirement and Pension System for certain  $\overline{7}$ <del>member and</del> retiree information that is necessary for certain direct mailings by 8 the retiree <del>organizations</del> organization; prohibiting a certain retiree 9 organizations organization from including certain information in certain direct mailings; requiring the Board of Trustees to provide certain retiree 10 11 organizations mail processing centers with certain information subject to certain agreements; providing that the procurement of a certain mail processing 12center is the sole responsibility of a certain retiree organization; requiring a 13 14certain retiree organizations organization to provide certain supplies required for certain direct mailings and to pay certain costs with regard to those direct 15

4 (2) THE DIRECT MAILINGS MAY NOT BE FOR THE PURPOSE OF 5 SUPPORTING OR OPPOSING ANY POLITICAL PARTY, BALLOT MEASURE, OR 6 CANDIDATE IN ANY ELECTION, INCLUDING ANY STATE GENERAL OR PRIMARY 7 ELECTION OR ANY ELECTION WITHIN THE RETIREE ORGANIZATION.

8 (3) (1) THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL PROVIDE THE 9 RETIREE ORGANIZATION WITH RETIREE DATA FOR ADDRESSING ENVELOPES 10 ONLY TO THE MAIL <u>PROCESSING</u> CENTER UNDER A SECURE DATA SHARE 11 AGREEMENT WITH THE MAIL <u>PROCESSING</u> CENTER UNDER WHICH NEITHER THE 12 RETIREE ORGANIZATION NOR ANY OTHER ENTITY HAS DIRECT ACCESS TO ANY 13 NAMES OR ADDRESSES.

14(II)IF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES PROVIDES ANY RETIREE15DATA TO A MAIL PROCESSING CENTER UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS16PARAGRAPH, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES IS NOT REQUIRED TO NOTIFY A17RETIREE WHOSE DATA IS RELEASED OF THE PROVISIONS OF § 21–504 OF THIS18TITLE.

19 (D) (C) THE DIRECT MAILING SHALL PROVIDE MEMBERS AND 20 RETIREES OF THE SEVERAL SYSTEMS WHO ARE MEMBERS OF THE RETIREE 21 ORGANIZATION OR ELIGIBLE TO BECOME MEMBERS OF THE RETIREE 22 ORGANIZATION WITH INFORMATION THAT EXPLAINS THE SERVICES OFFERED 23 BY THE RETIREE ORGANIZATION.

24(E)(D)(1)A RETIREE ORGANIZATION IS SOLELY RESPONSIBLE25FOR THE PROCUREMENT OF A MAIL PROCESSING CENTER UNDER THIS SECTION.

26 (2) THE RETIREE ORGANIZATION SHALL PROVIDE ALL PRINTED 27 MATERIALS TO BE MAILED AND ENVELOPES TO A MAIL PROCESSING CENTER.

28 (2) (3) THE RETIREE ORGANIZATION IS RESPONSIBLE FOR 29 PAYING ALL COSTS FOR GENERATING MAILING LABELS, INSERTING MATERIALS 30 INTO ENVELOPES, SEALING, LABELING, AND DELIVERING MATERIALS TO BE 31 MAILED TO A BULK MAIL CENTER OR POST OFFICE.

32(3)(4)THE RETIREE ORGANIZATION IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL33POSTAGE COSTS INVOLVED FOR THE DIRECT MAILINGS.

34(F) (E)THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES IS NOT LIABLE FOR THE CONTENT35OF ANY DIRECT MAILING SENT UNDER THIS SECTION.
