CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Washington County – Salary Study Process**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the method of selecting an at large member of the
4 Washington County Salary Study Commission; repealing the requirement that
5 the Commission study the salary of the Washington County State’s Attorney;
6 requiring the County Commissioners for Washington County to set certain
7 salaries within a certain period of time, subject to certain requirements;
8 repealing a certain requirement that the County Commissioners submit certain
9 recommendations to the legislative delegation; requiring the Commission to
10 consider certain information when formulating its report and recommendations;
11 and generally relating to the study of salaries of Washington County public
12 officials.

6 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
7 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

8 **Article 24 – Political Subdivisions – Miscellaneous Provisions**

9 12–202.

10 There is a Washington County Salary Study Commission.

11 12–203.

12 (b) The Commission shall be comprised as follows:

13 (1) One member from the Democratic Party Central Committee of
14 Washington County;

15 (2) One member from the Republican Party Central Committee of
16 Washington County;

17 (3) One member from the Washington County Chamber of Commerce;

18 (4) One member from the Washington County Farm Bureau;

19 (5) One member from the League of Women Voters of Washington
20 County;

21 (6) One member from the Western Maryland Central Labor Council;

22 (7) One member from the Cumberland Valley Associated Builders and
23 Contractors, Inc.;

24 (8) One member from the Joint Veterans Council of Washington
25 County; and

26 (9) One member at large selected by the [Executive Committee of the
27 Washington County Council of PTA's. The president of the Council may be the
28 member selected] **WASHINGTON COUNTY RETIRED TEACHERS ASSOCIATION.**

29 12–205.

30 (a) The Commission shall study the salaries of the Washington County:

- 1 (1) Board of County Commissioners;
- 2 (2) Board of Education;
- 3 (3) Orphans' Court judges;
- 4 (4) Sheriff;
- 5 (5) [State's Attorney;
- 6 (6)] Treasurer;
- 7 [(7)] (6) Board of Supervisors of Elections; and
- 8 [(8)] (7) Board of Liquor License Commissioners.

9 (b) (1) On or before November 20, 1996, and on or before December 1 each
10 fourth year thereafter, the Commission shall issue a report containing
11 recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners for review and consideration.

12 (2) **WITHIN 45 DAYS AFTER RECEIVING THE RECOMMENDATIONS**
13 **OF THE COMMISSION, THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SHALL SET BY**
14 **LOCAL LAW THE SALARY FOR EACH OFFICE INCLUDED IN THE**
15 **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

16 (i) **SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION; AND**

17 (ii) **WITH RESPECT TO A PUBLIC OFFICIAL, IN ACCORDANCE**
18 **WITH ARTICLE III, § 35 OF THE MARYLAND CONSTITUTION.**

19 (3) The Board of County Commissioners may accept, reduce, or reject
20 but may not increase the recommendations of the Commission.

21 [(2) On or before December 15, 1996, and on or before December 15
22 each fourth year thereafter, the Board of County Commissioners shall submit
23 recommendations to the legislative delegation concerning the salaries of the offices in
24 subsection (a) of this section.]

26 **THE COMMISSION SHALL CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING FOR EACH OFFICE**
27 **IN FORMULATING ITS REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS:**

28 (1) **THE SCOPE OF RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE OFFICE;**

1 **(2) THE EDUCATION, SKILLS, ABILITIES, LICENSURE, AND**
2 **CERTIFICATION REQUIRED TO PERFORM THE DUTIES OF THE OFFICE;**

3 **(3) THE SALARIES OF SIMILAR OFFICES IN OTHER**
4 **JURISDICTIONS;**

5 **(4) THE TIME REQUIRED TO PERFORM THE DUTIES OF THE**
6 **OFFICE;**

7 **(5) THE SALARIES OF SUBORDINATE EMPLOYEES UNDER THE**
8 **DIRECT SUPERVISION OF THE OFFICE;**

9 **(6) THE VOLUME OF WORKLOAD OF THE OFFICE; AND**

10 **(7) ANY OTHER INFORMATION THAT THE COMMISSION DEEMS**
11 **RELEVANT.**

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 October 1, 2010.
