## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Criminal Law – Self–Defense – Immunity for Use of Physical Force in Defense
3 of Dwelling or Place of Business

- 4 FOR the purpose of establishing that an occupant of a dwelling or place of business is 5 justified in using any degree of physical force, including deadly physical force, 6 against another person when that other person has made an unlawful entry into 7 the dwelling or place of business and the occupant has certain reasonable beliefs 8 concerning the acts or intended acts of the other person; providing that an 9 occupant of a dwelling or place of business using physical force, including deadly physical force, in accordance with this Act shall be immune from criminal 10 prosecution and civil liability for the use of the force; providing certain 11 12 exceptions to the provisions of this Act; and generally relating to the defense of 13 self-defense.
