- FOR the purpose of designating the English language as the official language of Harford County; making provisions of this Act applicable to certain Harford County functions and agencies; providing for certain exceptions; providing that this Act may not be construed to require the translation into English of any official motto or slogan; making the provisions of this Act severable; and generally relating to the designation of English as the official language of Harford County.

1 (C) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION, THE 2 COUNTY AGENCIES AND FUNCTIONS SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS 3 SECTION SHALL:

4 (1) WRITE AND PUBLISH EACH OFFICIAL DOCUMENT IN ENGLISH; 5 AND

6 (2) CONDUCT EACH MEETING AND OTHER OFFICIAL ORAL 7 COMMUNICATION THE AGENCIES AUTHORIZE IN ENGLISH.

8 (D) THE COUNTY AGENCIES AND FUNCTIONS SUBJECT TO THE 9 PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION MAY CONDUCT AFFAIRS IN A LANGUAGE OTHER 10 THAN ENGLISH TO:

11 (1) COMPLY WITH FEDERAL LAW;

12 (2) **PROTECT PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY;**

13 (3) PROTECT THE RIGHTS OF CIVIL LITIGANTS, CRIMINAL 14 DEFENDANTS, OR VICTIMS OF CRIME;

15 (4) ASSIST STUDENTS WHO ARE NOT PROFICIENT IN THE 16 ENGLISH LANGUAGE BY PROVIDING ENGLISH INSTRUCTION TO FACILITATE AS 17 RAPIDLY AS POSSIBLE A TRANSITION TO THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE;

18 **(5) PROVIDE INTERPRETATION FOR DEAF INDIVIDUALS IN** 19 **AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE;**

20 (6) TEACH A FOREIGN LANGUAGE;

21 (7) PROMOTE THE ARTS, INTERNATIONAL COMMERCE, OR 22 TOURISM; OR

23(8)ASSIST INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE NOT PROFICIENT IN ENGLISH24IN THE CONDUCT OF GOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS.

25 (E) THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO REQUIRE THE 26 TRANSLATION INTO ENGLISH OF ANY OFFICIAL MOTTO OR SLOGAN.

27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if any provision of this 28 Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any 29 reason in a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other 30 provisions or any other application of this Act which can be given effect without the

- 1 invalid provision or application, and for this purpose the provisions of this Act are 2 declared severable.
- 3 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 4 October 1, 2010.
