A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Motor Fuel Refiner or Supplier – Games of Chance – Repeal of Prohibition

3 FOR the purpose of repealing a provision prohibiting a refiner or other supplier of 4 motor fuel to a retail service station from engaging in, sponsoring, promoting, $\mathbf{5}$ advertising, or otherwise performing or participating in certain games of chance 6 that would be marketed or offered to the public at certain retail service stations; 7 repealing a provision authorizing certain suppliers to participate in certain 8 games of chance sponsored by entities other than certain refiners or suppliers of 9 motor fuel; repealing a provision prohibiting certain suppliers from requiring 10 certain retail station dealers to pay for certain costs; and generally relating to 11 games of chance and motor fuel refiners or suppliers.

Article – Business Regulation

20 [10-502.

(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, a refiner or other
supplier of motor fuel to a retail service station may not engage in, sponsor, promote,
advertise, or otherwise perform or participate in a game of chance to be marketed or
offered to the public at a retail service station in the State.

1 (b) (1) A supplier of motor fuel authorized under this title to operate retail 2 service stations may, at such stations, participate in a game of chance promoted or 3 sponsored by entities other than a refiner or supplier of motor fuel.

4 (2) A supplier of motor fuel authorized under this section to conduct a 5 game of chance may not require a retail service station dealer to pay for any costs 6 related to the game of chance.]
