2 High Performance Buildings Act – Applicable to Community College Capital 3 Projects

- FOR the purpose of making the High Performance Buildings Act applicable to 4 5 community college capital projects that receive State funds; authorizing a 6 community college to apply for a waiver from certain high performance building 7 requirements under a certain waiver process established by the Department of 8 Budget and Management and the Department of General Services; making this 9 Act applicable to certain capital projects that have not initiated a certain Request for Proposal on or before a certain date; making a technical correction; 10 and generally relating to the construction of high performance buildings at 11 12 community colleges.
