1 AN ACT concerning

2 Child Pornography – Matter Reflecting Belief That a Minor Is Depicted in a 3 Certain Manner

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from knowingly promoting, advertising, $\mathbf{5}$ presenting, soliciting, distributing, or possessing with the intent to distribute 6 any matter, purported matter, visual representation, or performance that 7reflects the belief, or is intended to cause another to believe, that the matter 8 depicts a minor engaged as a subject of sadomasochistic abuse or sexual 9 conduct; expanding a certain provision of the child pornography laws so as to 10 prohibit a person from knowingly advertising, presenting, or soliciting any matter, purported matter, visual representation, or performance that depicts a 11 12minor engaged as a subject of sadomasochistic abuse or sexual conduct; and 13 generally relating to child pornography.

19SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF20MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 Article – Criminal Law

In an action brought under this section, the State is not 1 (ii) $\mathbf{2}$ required to identify or produce testimony from the minor who is depicted in the 3 obscene matter or in any visual representation or performance that depicts the minor 4 engaged as a subject in sadomasochistic abuse or sexual conduct. The trier of fact may determine whether an individual who is $\mathbf{5}$ (2)6 depicted in an obscene matter, or any visual representation or performance as the subject in sadomasochistic abuse or sexual conduct, was a minor by: 78 (i) observation of the matter depicting the individual; 9 (ii) oral testimony by a witness to the production of the matter, representation, or performance; 10 expert medical testimony; or 11 (iii) 12(iv) any other method authorized by an applicable provision of 13law or rule of evidence. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 1415October 1, 2010.
