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Vehicle Laws -	Single	Registration	Plate
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FOR the purpose of requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to issue a single registration plate to all classes of vehicles; providing for the method of attachment of the registration plate; making certain conforming changes and a certain technical correction; authorizing the publisher of the Annotated Code to make certain corrections; and generally relating to vehicle registration plates.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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1 (d) Registration plates may be reflectorized and shall be manufactured of a 2 material warranted to have a durability of at least 5 years. However, prior to 3 registration plates being reflectorized, the Administration shall obtain approval of the 4 General Assembly through a budget item.

5 (e) (1) During subsequent registration years, the Administrator may 6 order the continued use of registration plates that are valid during any current 7 registration year, and, after so doing, the Administrator shall issue, at the time a 8 vehicle's registration is renewed, a validation tab to evidence payment of the vehicle's 9 annual registration fee.

10 (2) The tab shall be displayed on the [plates] **PLATE** of the vehicle in 11 the manner that the Administrator requires.

12 (3) The Administrator from time to time shall evaluate the condition 13 of registration plates issued under this title and may provide for the manufacture and 14 issuance of new registration plates. These new registration plates shall be issued and 15 subsequently validated in the manner required by this subtitle.

16 (f) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection [(c)] (D) of this section, the 17 Administration may issue reflectorized registration plates under §§ 13–618 and 18 13–619 of this title.

19 (g) The dimensions of a registration plate issued for a Class D (motorcycle) 20 vehicle shall be 7 inches wide by 4 inches high.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any reference in the 7 Annotated Code of Maryland to multiple registration plates rendered obsolete by this 8 Act shall be corrected by the publisher of the Annotated Code, in consultation with the 9 Department of Legislative Services, with no further action required by the General 10 Assembly. The publisher shall adequately describe corrections made under this 11 section in the editor's note following the section affected.
