1 (A) THE ADMINISTRATION, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE STATE 2 HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION, MAY ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS THAT ARE 3 CONSISTENT WITH 49 C.F.R., PART 387.

4 (B) THE RULES AND REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) 5 OF THIS SECTION SHALL APPLY TO THE FOLLOWING VEHICLES:

6 (1) FOR-HIRE VEHICLES ENGAGED IN INTRASTATE COMMERCE 7 THAT EXCEED A GROSS VEHICLE WEIGHT RATING OF 26,000 POUNDS AND ARE 8 DESIGNED TO CARRY PROPERTY;

9 (2) FOR-HIRE VEHICLES ENGAGED IN INTERSTATE COMMERCE 10 THAT:

15 (3) VEHICLES THAT ARE REQUIRED TO BE MARKED OR 16 PLACARDED FOR THE TRANSPORTATION OF HAZARDOUS MATERIALS OR 17 OTHERWISE ARE SUBJECT TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF 49 C.F.R., PART 387 18 WHEN TRANSPORTING HAZARDOUS MATERIALS.

19 (C) ANY MOTOR CARRIER OPERATING A VEHICLE THAT IS SUBJECT TO 20 THE RULES AND REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL, AT ALL 21 TIMES WHEN OPERATING THE VEHICLE ON A HIGHWAY IN THE STATE, COMPLY 22 WITH THE RULES AND REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 24 January 1, 2011.
