CHAPTER	
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1 AN ACT concerning

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Victims' Rights - Fatal Vehicular Accident - Suspension of License

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a victim's representative to be present at a certain administrative hearing concerning a fatal vehicular accident; authorizing a 4 5 victim's representative to make an oral statement or submit a written 6 statement for consideration at a certain administrative hearing concerning a 7 fatal vehicular accident; requiring a law enforcement officer, during the 8 investigation of a fatal vehicular accident, to inform a victim's representative of 9 the right to file a certain request with the Motor Vehicle Administration; 10 requiring certain notice to a victim's representative under certain circumstances; authorizing the Administration to suspend a license of a person 11 12 who is convicted of a moving violation that contributed to an accident resulting 13 in the death of an individual; providing for certain procedures; defining certain 14 terms; and generally relating to victims' rights and license suspensions 15 concerning certain fatal vehicular accidents.

- 13 (3) (I) If A VICTIM'S REPRESENTATIVE INTENDS TO MAKE AN ORAL STATEMENT, THE VICTIM'S REPRESENTATIVE SHALL NOTIFY THE ADMINISTRATION AT LEAST 10 DAYS BEFORE THE HEARING.
- 16 (II) If A VICTIM'S REPRESENTATIVE INTENDS TO SUBMIT A
 17 WRITTEN STATEMENT, THE STATEMENT SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE
 18 ADMINISTRATION AT LEAST 10 DAYS BEFORE THE HEARING.
- 19 (D) (1) IF A VICTIM'S REPRESENTATIVE PROVIDES NOTICE IN 20 ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (C)(3)(I) OF THIS SECTION, THE 21 ADMINISTRATION SHALL ALLOW THE VICTIM'S REPRESENTATIVE TO MAKE AN 22 ORAL STATEMENT FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE ADMINISTRATION AT THE 23 HEARING.
- 24 (2) If A VICTIM'S REPRESENTATIVE SUBMITS A WRITTEN STATEMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (C)(3)(II) OF THIS SECTION, THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL:

9 10 11 12	(F) IN ACCORDANCE WITH TITLE 12, SUBTITLE 2 OF THIS ARTICLE, THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL PROVIDE NOTICE OF A SUSPENSION UNDER SUBSECTION (A)(5) OF THIS SECTION AND THE LICENSEE MAY REQUEST A HEARING.
