CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Real Property - Transfer Fees - Prohibition

FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person who conveys a fee simple interest in real property from recording a covenant for the payment of a transfer fee under certain circumstances; establishing that a covenant that requires a certain payment of a transfer fee is void under certain circumstances; defining a certain term; providing for the application of this Act; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the prohibition on transfer fees on real property.

15 Preamble

WHEREAS, It is the public policy of the State of Maryland to favor the marketability of real property and the transferability of interests in real property free of title defects or unreasonable restraints on alienation; and

WHEREAS, Certain private, nongovernmental transfer fee covenants violate the public policy by impairing the marketability and transferability of real property by

- 1 constituting an unreasonable restraint on alienation regardless of the duration of such covenants or the amount of such transfer fees; and
- WHEREAS, Private transfer fees are an attempt to retain part of the fee simple title without having any right of possession presently or in the future; and
- WHEREAS, Courts consistently have turned back attempts by landowners to create new estates in land beyond those recognized at common law; and

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1 2 3	(C) (1) A PERSON WHO CONVEYS A FEE SIMPLE INTEREST IN REAL PROPERTY MAY NOT RECORD A COVENANT AGAINST THE TITLE TO THE REAL PROPERTY FOR THE PAYMENT OF A TRANSFER FEE.
4 5 6	(2) A COVENANT THAT REQUIRES THE PAYMENT OF A TRANSFER FEE ON THE CONVEYANCE OF A FEE SIMPLE INTEREST IN REAL PROPERTY IS VOID.
7 8 9 10	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or application to any instrument conveying an interest in real property that is signed by the vendor before the effective date of this Act.
11 12 13 14 15	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
