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## Nonpublic Schools - Bullying Policies - Compliance Nonpublic Schools - Bullying, Harassment, and Intimidation - Policies

FOR the purpose of providing that certain provisions of law regarding the 4 5 development of a certain bullying, harassment, and intimidation policy apply to 6 nonpublic schools that accept certain State money; providing that certain 7 provisions of law do not apply to nonpublic schools that accept State money for 8 the placement of students with disabilities in nonpublic programs; and 9 generally relating to bullying policies in nonpublic schools requiring nonpublic 10 schools that accept State funds to adopt a policy prohibiting bullying. harassment, and intimidation by a certain date; requiring the policy to include 11 certain provisions; encouraging a nonpublic school to develop the policy in 12 13 consultation with certain groups; encouraging a nonpublic school to publicize the policy in a certain manner; encouraging a nonpublic school to develop 14 15 certain educational programs in its efforts to prevent bullying, harassment, and 16 intimidation; providing that certain nonpublic school employees who report acts 17 of bullying, harassment, or intimidation are not civilly liable under certain 18 circumstances; providing that this Act may not be construed to limit the legal rights of a victim of bullying, harassment, or intimidation; defining certain 19 20 terms; and generally relating to policies prohibiting bullying, harassment, and 21 intimidation in nonpublic schools that accept State funds.
