A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Health Occupations - Pharmacists - Disposal of Unused Prescription Drugs ("Operation Take-back")

4 FOR the purpose of requiring certain containers of prescription drugs to include $\mathbf{5}$ certain information; requiring certain labels of prescription drugs to include a 6 certain notice; requiring certain pharmacists to include a certain information 7 sheet with certain prescription drugs; requiring pharmacies to develop a 8 program for the disposal of unused prescription drugs; requiring the program to 9 include the provision of certain containers; requiring pharmacies to dispose of certain containers in a certain manner; requiring pharmacies to post a certain 10 11 notice; and generally relating to the disposal of unused prescription drugs.

Preamble

WHEREAS, It is in the public interest that prescription drugs that have outlived their expiration date or are in excess of a patient's need should be disposed of in a safe and efficient manner; and

3 (B) (1) IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER INFORMATION REQUIRED BY 4 LAW, THE LABEL SHALL INCLUDE A NOTICE ADVISING THE RETAIL CONSUMER 5 OF THE PROPER DISPOSAL OF ANY UNUSED PRESCRIPTION DRUGS IN THE 6 CONTAINER.

(2) IF A DRUG IS ON THE FEDERAL DRUG ADMINISTRATION LIST
OF UNUSED DRUGS THAT SHOULD BE FLUSHED DOWN THE TOILET, THE NOTICE
9 SHALL STATE: "FLUSH UNUSED PORTIONS OF THIS DRUG DOWN THE TOILET.".

10 (3) IF A DRUG IS NOT ON THE FEDERAL DRUG ADMINISTRATION 11 LIST OF UNUSED DRUGS THAT SHOULD BE FLUSHED DOWN THE TOILET, THE 12 NOTICE SHALL STATE: "DISPOSE OF UNUSED PORTIONS OF THIS DRUG IN 13 ACCORDANCE WITH THE ENCLOSED INFORMATION SHEET.".

14 (C) A PHARMACIST SHALL INCLUDE WITH EACH PRESCRIPTION DRUG 15 DISPENSED AN INFORMATION SHEET THAT PROVIDES THE CURRENT FEDERAL 16 DRUG ADMINISTRATION GUIDELINES FOR DRUG DISPOSAL THAT ARE 17 AVAILABLE FROM THE FEDERAL DRUG ADMINISTRATION INTERNET WEBSITE.

18 (D) (1) EACH PHARMACY SHALL DEVELOP A PROGRAM FOR THE 19 DISPOSAL OF UNUSED PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.

(2) THE PROGRAM SHALL INCLUDE THE PROVISION OF A SECURE
 CONTAINER INTO WHICH THE CONSUMER MAY DEPOSIT UNUSED DRUGS FOR
 DISPOSAL BY THE PHARMACY.

23 (3) THE CONTAINERS SHALL BE PLACED IN A CONSPICUOUS

(5) A PHARMACY SHALL PLACE ON PERMANENT DISPLAY A
WRITTEN NOTICE THAT IS IN A TYPEFACE THAT IS LARGE ENOUGH TO BE EASILY
LEGIBLE TO THE AVERAGE PERSON FROM A DISTANCE OF 8 FEET AND THAT IS
IN A LOCATION THAT IS PLAINLY VISIBLE TO THE RETAIL CONSUMERS OF THE
PHARMACY NOTIFYING THE CONSUMERS OF:

33 (I) THE AVAILABILITY OF THE PRESCRIPTION DRUG 34 DISPOSAL PROGRAM; AND 1 (II) THE POSITIVE EFFECT ON WATER QUALITY DERIVED 2 FROM THE PROPER DISPOSAL OF UNUSED PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.
