SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 5 (a) For fiscal year 2010 [and fiscal year 2011], the Governor shall include at 6 least \$7,000,000 in the annual budget in appropriations for activities aimed at 7 reducing tobacco use in Maryland as recommended by the Centers for Disease Control 8 and Prevention, including:
- 9 (1) Media campaigns aimed at reducing smoking initiation and 10 encouraging smokers to quit smoking;
- 11 (2) Media campaigns educating the public about the dangers of secondhand smoke exposure;
- 13 (3) Enforcement of existing laws banning the sale or distribution of tobacco products to minors;
- 15 (4) Promotion and implementation of smoking cessation programs; 16 and
- 17 (5) Implementation of school-based tobacco education programs.
- 18 (b) For fiscal year [2006] **2011**, the Governor shall include at least [\$10,000,000] **\$6,000,000** in the annual budget in appropriations for the purposes described in subsection (a) of this section.

- (II) For fiscal year [2010 and fiscal year 2011] **2015** AND EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, the Governor shall include at least [\$1,250,000] **\$2,000,000** in the annual budget in appropriations for the Statewide Academic Health Center Tobacco–Related Diseases Research Grant under this section.
