## A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Baltimore City Charter – Community Benefits District – East Baltimore

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to establish 4 by ordinance a Community Benefits District in the East Baltimore section to be  $\mathbf{5}$ a special tax district and provide certain services; authorizing the Mayor and 6 City Council to establish a Community Benefits District Authority to provide 7 certain services; requiring a certain ordinance to include certain provisions; 8 requiring the Authority to establish a certain financial plan for the District 9 under certain circumstances; requiring a certain financial plan to be subject to 10 approval by the Baltimore City Board of Estimates; requiring the Authority to hold a public hearing on a certain financial plan; providing that certain property 11 12that is exempt from certain taxes be exempt from District taxes; authorizing the 13Authority to request that certain owners voluntarily contribute to the costs of 14the Authority; providing for a Board of Directors of the Authority; providing 15certain powers, duties, and limitations of the Community Benefits District 16Authority; providing that the District, Authority, Board of Directors, and District Administrator shall benefit from certain laws limiting liability under 17 certain circumstances; providing that the Authority shall be subject to certain 18 City ordinances and goals regarding minority and women's business 19 20enterprises; requiring the Mayor and City Council to take certain matters into 21consideration and make certain determinations when enacting certain 22ordinances; prohibiting the Mayor and City Council from authorizing certain 23reductions in services; providing for the reversion of unspent funds under a 24certain condition; placing a certain condition on a certain ordinance taking 25effect; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the establishment of a 26Community Benefits District in East Baltimore.

1 (D) (1) THE AUTHORITY SHALL ESTABLISH A FINANCIAL PLAN FOR 2 THE DISTRICT WHEN REQUIRED BY AN ORDINANCE ENACTED UNDER THIS 3 SECTION.

4 (2) THE FINANCIAL PLAN, INCLUDING ITS ANNUAL BUDGET, 5 DISTRICT TAX RATES, AND SCHEDULE OF OTHER FEES AND CHARGES, SHALL BE 6 SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY THE BOARD OF ESTIMATES.

7 (3) THE FINANCIAL PLAN MAY INCLUDE PROVISIONS FOR 8 ALLOCATING RESOURCES TO THE PARTICULAR NEEDS OF THE DISTRICT, 9 INCLUDING ALLOCATIONS TO PARTICULAR SECTIONS OF THE DISTRICT OR TO 10 PARTICULAR USES WITHIN THE DISTRICT.

11 (E) (1) BEFORE ADOPTING ITS PROPOSED BUDGET AND MAKING ITS 12 RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE CITY, THE AUTHORITY SHALL HOLD A PUBLIC 13 HEARING ON THE FINANCIAL PLAN PROPOSED FOR THE DISTRICT.

14 (2) THE AUTHORITY SHALL PUBLISH NOTICE OF THE HEARING 15 UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION IN A NEWSPAPER OF GENERAL 16 CIRCULATION IN BALTIMORE CITY AT LEAST ONCE A WEEK FOR 3 CONSECUTIVE 17 WEEKS BEFORE THE HEARING.

18(3) PROPERTY IN THE DISTRICT THAT IS EXEMPT UNDER STATE19LAW FROM ORDINARY PROPERTY TAXES SHALL BE EXEMPT FROM DISTRICT20TAXES.

21 (4) THE AUTHORITY MAY REQUEST THE OWNERS OF PROPERTY 22 EXEMPT FROM TAXES UNDER PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION TO 23 VOLUNTARILY CONTRIBUTE TO THE COSTS OF THE AUTHORITY.

24 (F) (1) THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE AUTHORITY SHALL BE THE 25 BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

(2) EACH VOTING MEMBER OF THE BOARD SHALL BE AN OWNER,
OR, WHEN THE OWNER IS A CORPORATION, LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY,
PARTNERSHIP, TRUST, OR ANY OTHER LEGAL ENTITY, REPRESENTATIVES OF
OWNERS OF PROPERTIES IN THE DISTRICT THAT ARE SUBJECT TO DISTRICT
TAXES UNDER THIS SECTION.

(3) AN ORDINANCE ENACTED UNDER THIS SECTION MAY
 ESTABLISH TWO OR MORE CLASSES OF BOARD MEMBERS AND MAY REQUIRE

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1 (G) AS PROVIDED BY AN ORDINANCE ENACTED UNDER THIS SECTION, 2 THE AUTHORITY MAY:

3 (1) CONDUCT THE FUNCTIONS THAT ARE ASSIGNED TO THE 4 AUTHORITY BY THE ORDINANCE;

5 (2) ACQUIRE, HOLD, AND USE PROPERTY NECESSARY TO ACHIEVE 6 THE AUTHORITY'S PURPOSES;

ALLOWABLE BY LAW, FROM ALL PROVISIONS OF FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL
LAW LIMITING THE LIABILITY OF EMPLOYEES, OFFICERS, AGENTS, AND
OFFICIALS OF GOVERNMENTAL UNITS.

(I) THE AUTHORITY SHALL BE SUBJECT TO CITY ORDINANCES AND

17	MAY NOT ACT AS AGENTS OR EMPLOYEES OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF

$\frac{24}{25}$	(K) BEFORE ENACTING AN ORDINANCE UNDER THIS SECTION, THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE SHALL:
26	(1) PROVIDE FOR PUBLIC HEARINGS DURING WHICH
27	CONSIDERATION IS GIVEN TO THE VIEWS OF THE PROPERTY OWNERS, RETAIL
28	MERCHANTS, PROPERTY TENANTS, AND OTHER MEMBERS OF THE BUSINESS
29	AND RESIDENTIAL COMMUNITIES WITHIN THE PROPOSED DISTRICT;

1 (2) MAKE A DETERMINATION THAT THE PROPOSED DISTRICT 2 CREATED REFLECTS A DIVERSE MIX OF BUSINESS AND RESIDENTIAL 3 PROPERTIES; AND

4 (3) MAKE A DETERMINATION THAT THE PROPOSED DISTRICT 5 REFLECTS A DIVERSE ECONOMIC, SOCIAL, AND RACIAL MIX AMONG ITS 6 RESIDENTS AND WITHIN THE WORKING POPULATION EMPLOYED IN THE 7 PROPOSED DISTRICT.

8 (L) THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE MAY NOT PERMIT A 9 REDUCTION IN THE SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE CITY IN THE DISTRICT DUE TO 10 THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE DISTRICT OR THE AUTHORITY.

11 (M) IN THE EVENT OF A DISSOLUTION OF THE DISTRICT OR THE 12 AUTHORITY, ANY UNSPENT FUNDS SHALL REVERT BACK TO THE CITY'S 13 GENERAL FUND.

14 (N) (1) AN ORDINANCE ENACTED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL:

15(I) ESTABLISH THE PROCESS FOR THE APPROVAL OF THE16CREATION OF THE DISTRICT AND THE AUTHORITY; AND

17 (II) PROVIDE THAT UNTIL THE APPROVAL PROCESS IS 18 CONDUCTED AND APPROVAL IS ACHIEVED UNDER THE PROCESS THE DISTRICT 19 AND THE AUTHORITY MAY NOT BE CREATED, AND THE ORDINANCE MAY NOT 20 BECOME FULLY EFFECTIVE.

21 (2) THE ORDINANCE MAY PROVIDE:

22(I) CRITERIA FOR THE ELIGIBILITY OF VOTERS FOR23PURPOSES OF THE ELECTION REQUIRED BY THE ORDINANCE; AND

24(II) PROCEDURES FOR A SPECIAL ELECTION REQUIRED IN25THIS SUBSECTION, WHICH MAY BE ADMINISTERED BY WRITE-IN BALLOTS.

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 27 June 1, 2010.

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
