3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain schools to maintain a record of the daily 4 attendance of certain students using a certain identifier, calculate and maintain 5 a certain record of certain student attendance information, and submit a certain 6 report to the county board of education that includes certain student attendance 7 information at certain times each year; requiring each county board of 8 education to calculate and maintain a certain record of certain attendance 9 information; requiring a county board to report certain information to the State 10 Board of Education at least a certain number of times each year; requiring each 11 county board to develop and implement a certain attendance incentive action plan that includes certain information; defining certain terms; and generally 12 13 relating to tracking and reporting student attendance in public schools.
