### A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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#### **Children's Environmental Health Protection Act**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring each county board to adopt a health and safety policy 4 that includes certain standards for certain plans; providing for the scope of this  $\mathbf{5}$ Act; requiring a hazardous substance removal plan, a fire and life safety code 6 repair plan, and a facility and equipment violation plan to contain certain 7 provisions; requiring a health, safety, and environmental management plan to 8 require the use of certain cleaning and maintenance products; requiring the 9 Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, in conjunction with the Department 10 of the Environment, to adopt certain regulations; requiring a water intrusion 11 and moisture containment plan to require certain school personnel to take 12certain actions within a certain period of time; requiring each county board to 13conduct a walk-through of certain buildings to determine the status of each building regarding the presence of certain hazardous conditions; requiring the 14 15county board to appoint a certain observation team and requiring a certain 16observation team to consist of certain representatives; requiring a certain 17observation team to use a certain checklist; requiring the Department, in conjunction with the Department of the Environment, to develop a certain 1819 curriculum, certain model plans, and a certain employee training program; 20providing for the requirements of the employee training program; requiring 21each county board to submit certain plans to the Secretary of Health and 22Mental Hygiene on or before a certain date; requiring each county board to 23prepare, publish, and make available a certain annual report; requiring the 24Secretary to allow for public notice and an opportunity for public comment 25before approving a certain plan; requiring the Secretary to make certain 26information available to the public; authorizing county boards to deplete a 27certain supply of cleaning and maintenance products until a certain date; 28defining a certain term; and generally relating to children's environmental 29health.

24 (a) (1) Each county board shall make the reports required by the State25 Board and by the State Superintendent.

26 (2) The reports shall be made at the time, include the items, and be on 27 the forms required by the State Board and by the State Superintendent.

28 (b) (1) Each county board shall prepare, publish, and make available to 29 interested parties an annual report on the condition, current accomplishments, and 30 needs for improvement of the schools as well as a statement of the business and 31 financial transactions of the county board.

32(2)EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL PREPARE, PUBLISH, AND MAKE33AVAILABLE TO INTERESTED PARTIES AN ANNUAL REPORT ON THE PLANS

## 3 [(2)] (3) [This report] THE REPORTS REQUIRED UNDER THIS 4 SUBSECTION shall be published before the end of the calendar year.

5 (c) The public schools of each county shall use a uniform method, as required 6 by the county superintendent, for reporting the receipts, expenditures, and balances of 7 the operations and activities conducted by the public schools.

8 (d) (1) At the request of the county governing body made in writing at 9 least 30 days before the reporting deadline, the county board or superintendent shall 10 report to the county governing body on or before November 1 and March 1 of each 11 fiscal year on the school system's operations, including any adjustment made to the 12 approved annual budget.

13 (2) A report under this subsection shall be made available to all 14 interested persons.

15 (e) (1) At the request of the county board made in writing at least 30 days 16 before the reporting deadline the county governing body shall report to the county 17 board on or before November 1 and March 1 of each fiscal year on the county's fiscal 18 status for the immediate fiscal year and the subsequent fiscal year.

19 (2) A report under this subsection shall be made available to all 20 interested persons.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That each county board may deplete the supply of cleaning and maintenance products that are not third-party certified environmentally preferable products that are being used by the county board as of the effective date of this Act; however, the products that are not third-party certified environmentally preferable products may not be used after January 1, 2012.

26 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 27 July 1, 2010.
