A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Motor Vehicle Administration – Online Motor Vehicle Liability Insurance Verification System – Required Study

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to study the feasibility $\mathbf{5}$ and desirability of establishing an online Motor Vehicle Liability Insurance 6 Verification System to verify the compliance of a motor vehicle owner or 7operator with certain motor vehicle liability insurance requirements and proof 8 of security requirements; requiring the study to examine certain matters; 9 requiring the Administration, on or before a certain date, to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and certain committees; and generally 10 relating to a study by the Motor Vehicle Administration of an online Motor 11 12Vehicle Liability Insurance Verification System.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That:

15 (a) The Motor Vehicle Administration shall study the feasibility and 16 desirability of establishing an online Motor Vehicle Liability Insurance Verification 17 System to verify the compliance of a motor vehicle owner or operator with motor 18 vehicle liability insurance requirements and proof of security requirements under § 19 17–103 of the Transportation Article.

- (1) the cost of establishing and administering such a system;

(2) how the system will integrate with existing Administration andlaw enforcement systems;

- (3) appropriate measures to secure data against unauthorized access;

(4) how the system will accommodate low–volume insurers;

2 (5) how the system will track motor vehicles that are subject to 3 another form of security in place of a vehicle liability insurance policy as authorized 4 under § 17–103 of the Transportation Article; and

(6) any other matter the Administration considers important.

6 (c) On or before December 31, 2011, the Administration shall report the 7 findings of its study, together with any recommendations, to the Governor and, in 8 accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the Senate Finance 9 Committee and Judicial Proceedings Committee and the House Economic Matters 10 Committee and Environmental Matters Committee.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectJuly 1, 2010.
