A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Local Government - Street Lighting Equipment

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring a local government to pay a certain electric company the 4 fair market value of certain street lighting equipment as agreed on by the local 5 government and the electric company or as awarded by a jury in a 6 condemnation proceeding under certain circumstances; authorizing a local 7 government to include all street lighting equipment that the local government 8 seeks to acquire in its jurisdiction that is owned by one electric company in a 9 single petition of condemnation under certain circumstances; requiring a jury in 10 a certain condemnation proceeding to consider certain factors as part of an award under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the acquisition of 11 12 street lighting equipment by a local government from an electric company.

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
 - Article 24 Political Subdivisions Miscellaneous Provisions

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22 (a) In this section, "electric company" has the meaning stated in § 1–101 of the Public Utility Companies Article.



- (b) On written request by a local government, an electric company shall sell to the local government some or all of the electric company's existing street lighting equipment that is located within the local jurisdiction.
- (c) (1) If the local government purchases street lighting equipment from an electric company, the local government shall pay to the electric company the fair market value of the street lighting equipment AS AGREED ON BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND THE ELECTRIC COMPANY OR AS AWARDED BY A JURY IN A CONDEMNATION PROCEEDING.
- 9 (2) A LOCAL GOVERNMENT MAY INCLUDE IN A SINGLE PETITION
 10 FOR CONDEMNATION ALL STREET LIGHTING EQUIPMENT THAT THE LOCAL
 11 GOVERNMENT SEEKS TO ACQUIRE WITHIN ITS JURISDICTION THAT IS OWNED BY
 12 ONE ELECTRIC COMPANY.
- **(3)** IN A CONDEMNATION PROCEEDING BROUGHT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBSECTION, THE JURY SHALL CONSIDER AS A PART 15 OF AN AWARD:
- 16 (I) THE AGE, CONDITION, AND OPERABILITY OF THE 17 STREET LIGHTING EQUIPMENT;
- 18 (II) ANY PAYMENT BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT FOR THE 19 CONSTRUCTION OR MAINTENANCE OF THE STREET LIGHTING EQUIPMENT; AND
- 20 (III) ANY FEES ASSOCIATED WITH THE USE OF SPACE ON A
 21 POLE, LAMPPOST, OR OTHER MOUNTING SURFACE USED FOR STREET LIGHTING
 22 EQUIPMENT LOST TO THE ELECTRIC COMPANY DUE TO THE CONDEMNATION OF
 23 THE STREET LIGHTING EQUIPMENT.
 - (d) A local government that purchases the street lighting equipment in accordance with subsection (b) of this section shall be responsible for the maintenance of the street lighting equipment and may contract with an outside entity for the maintenance of the street lighting equipment.
 - (e) (1) Any person who controls the right to use space on any pole, lamppost, or other mounting surface previously used in the local jurisdiction by the electric company for street lighting equipment shall allow a local government that has purchased the street lighting equipment to assume the rights and obligations of the electric company with respect to the space for the unexpired term of any lease or other agreement under which the electric company used the space.
 - (2) Notwithstanding paragraph (1) of this subsection, the local government may not restrict or prohibit universal access for electricity or any other service by assuming the rights and obligations of an electric company as to space on any pole, lampost, or other mounting surface used for street lighting equipment.

- 1 (3) Any dispute between an electric company and a local government 2 arising under this subsection shall be submitted to the Public Service Commission for 3 resolution.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2010.
