HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

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Judicial Compensation Commission – Recommendations

FOR the purpose of proposing an alteration to the compensation of the members of the
Judiciary in this State in accordance with Section 1–708 of the Courts and
Judicial Proceedings Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.

6 WHEREAS, Section 1–708(b)(2) of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article 7of the Annotated Code of Maryland establishes a seven-member Judicial 8 Compensation Commission appointed by the Governor with two members appointed 9 on nomination of the President of the Senate, two members appointed on nomination 10 of the Speaker of the House of Delegates, one member appointed on nomination of the Maryland State Bar Association, and two members appointed at large. The Judicial 11 12Compensation Commission is constituted as follows: appointments made on the 13nomination of the President of the Senate: John Paterakis and Elizabeth Buck; 14appointments made on the nomination of the Speaker of the House of Delegates: 15Thomas Barbera and Raymond Langston; appointment made on the nomination of the Maryland State Bar Association: Edward Gilliss; and appointments at large: Annette 16 17J. Funn and Alice G. Pinderhughes. The Commission members elected Elizabeth Buck to serve as the chair of the Commission. The Commission is charged with reviewing 18 19 the salaries of the judges of the Judiciary of Maryland and making written 20recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly every 4 years; and

21WHEREAS, Section 1–708(d) of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article of 22the Annotated Code of Maryland provides as follows: the General Assembly may 23amend this Joint Resolution to decrease any of the Commission's salary 24recommendations, but no reduction may diminish the salary of a judge during the 25judge's continuance in office. The General Assembly may not amend this Joint 26Resolution to increase these recommended salaries. Should the General Assembly not 27adopt or amend this Joint Resolution within 50 days of its introduction, the salaries 28recommended herein shall apply during fiscal years 2011 through 2014. Should the 29General Assembly reject any or all of the salaries herein recommended, the salaries of 30 the judges so affected shall remain unchanged during fiscal years 2011 through 2014 31 unless modified under other provisions of the law; and



WHEREAS, The Judicial Compensation Commission held three meetings in 1 $\mathbf{2}$ September and October 2008. The Commission considered many aspects and facets of 3 judicial compensation. The Commission did not meet in 2009, but each member 4 participated in a telephone poll, conducted by staff of the Department of Legislative $\mathbf{5}$ Services in November 2009, and voted to resubmit the recommendations made in the Commission's January 2009 report. The Commission by a vote of five or more of its 6 members has recommended judicial salaries for fiscal years 2011 through 2014; now, 78 therefore, be it
