A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Natural Resources – Right to Hunt, Fish, and Harvest Wild Game

- FOR the purpose of proposing an amendment to the Maryland Constitution that
 establishes the right of every person to hunt, fish, or harvest wild game, subject
 to certain laws; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the
 State of Maryland for their adoption or rejection.
- 7 BY proposing an addition to the Maryland Constitution
- 8 Declaration of Rights
- 9 Article 48

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 11 MARYLAND, (Three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses 12 concurring), That it be proposed that the Maryland Constitution read as follows:

Declaration of Rights

14 **ARTICLE 48.**

15 THAT EVERY PERSON SHALL HAVE A RIGHT TO HUNT, FISH, OR HARVEST 16 WILD GAME, SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS AND RESTRICTIONS UNDER LAWS THAT 17 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ENACTS.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly 19 determines that the amendment to the Maryland Constitution proposed by this Act 20 affects multiple jurisdictions and that the provisions of Article XIV, § 1 of the 21 Maryland Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments do not 22 apply.

SENATE BILL 33

1 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the aforegoing section $\mathbf{2}$ proposed as an amendment to the Maryland Constitution shall be submitted to the 3 legal and qualified voters of this State at the next general election to be held in 4 November, 2010 for their adoption or rejection pursuant to Article XIV of the $\mathbf{5}$ Maryland Constitution. At that general election, the vote on this proposed amendment 6 to the Constitution shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the 7words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now provided by law. Immediately after the election, all returns shall 8 9 be made to the Governor of the vote for and against the proposed amendment, as directed by Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution, and further proceedings had in 10 accordance with Article XIV. 11
