BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - State Government

(a) 4 The Committee consists of the following 15 members: (b) (1) three members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the 5 Senate; 6 7 three members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the (2)Speaker of the House of Delegates; 8 9 the Secretary of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation, or the (3)10 Secretary's designee; 11 the Secretary of Business and Economic Development, or the **(4)** 12 Secretary's designee; 13 a representative of the Maryland Retailers Association, designated 14 by the Maryland Retailers Association; 15 (6) a representative of the Maryland Chamber of Commerce, 16 designated by the Maryland Chamber of Commerce; 17 (7)a representative of the National Federation of Independent Business, designated by the National Federation of Independent Business: 18 19 a representative of the Job Opportunities Task Force, designated (8)20 by the Job Opportunities Task Force; 21two representatives of union labor, designated by the Maryland 22 State and District of Columbia AFL-CIO: and 23 a representative of the academic profession who is knowledgeable 24in unemployment insurance law, designated jointly by the President of the Senate and 25the Speaker of the House of Delegates.
- 26 The members of the Committee serve at the pleasure of the presiding officer who appointed them. 27
- 28 The President and the Speaker shall appoint a Senator and a Delegate, 29 respectively, each to serve as cochair.

1 2 3	(e) (1) The Committee shall examine the condition of the unemployment insurance system in the State as a result of the implementation of Chapter 169 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2005.
4 5 6 7 8	(2) The Committee may examine the need for additional alterations to the unemployment insurance system, including the charging and taxation provisions and the eligibility and benefit provisions, in consideration of the fairness of the system and in order to maintain the Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund at a level sufficient to ensure that benefits will be paid from the Fund.
9 10	(f) (1) The Department of Legislative Services shall provide staffing for the Committee.
11 12	(2) The Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation shall report to the Committee on the condition of unemployment insurance in the State.
13 14 15	(g) A member of the Committee may not receive compensation for serving on the Committee, but is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
16 17 18	(h) The Committee shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, subject to $\S 2-1246$ of this title, the General Assembly on December 31 of each year.
