A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws – Registration and Driver’s License Renewal Fees – No Charge**
3 **for Recipients of Medal of Honor**

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Motor Vehicle Administration from charging a
5 recipient of the Medal of Honor a fee for the renewal of the registration of a
6 vehicle owned by the Medal of Honor recipient or for the renewal of the Medal of
7 Honor recipient’s noncommercial driver’s license; and generally relating to
8 vehicle registration and driver’s license renewal fees.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article – Transportation**

1 **THE ADMINISTRATION MAY NOT CHARGE A RECIPIENT OF THE MEDAL OF**
2 **HONOR A FEE FOR THE RENEWAL OF THE REGISTRATION OF A VEHICLE OWNED**
3 **BY THE MEDAL OF HONOR RECIPIENT.**

5 (b) **(1) [For] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS**
6 **SUBSECTION, FOR** the renewal of a noncommercial Class A, B, C, D, E, or M driver's
7 license, a licensee shall pay the Administration a renewal fee established by the
8 Administration.

9 **(2) THE ADMINISTRATION MAY NOT CHARGE A LICENSEE WHO IS**
10 **A RECIPIENT OF THE MEDAL OF HONOR A FEE FOR THE RENEWAL OF THE**
11 **LICENSEE'S NONCOMMERCIAL CLASS A, B, C, D, E, OR M DRIVER'S LICENSE.**

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 October 1, 2010.
