AN ESTABLISHMENT THAT IS A BONA FIDE RESTAURANT, MOTEL, OR HOTEL MAY OBTAIN A CLASS B (ON SALE) BEER, WINE AND LIQUOR LICENSE FROM THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS IF
13	THE ESTABLISHMENT HAS:
