 of law relating to the employment of certain employees who have been convicted
 of certain crimes; and generally relating to nonpublic schools.

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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- 17 (a) A nonpublic school that is subject to the requirements of this title may 18 not hire or retain any employee who works with or has access to students and who the
- 19 school knows has been convicted of a crime involving:
- 20 (1) An offense under § 3–307 of the Criminal Law Article;



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- 1 (2) Child sexual abuse under § 3–602 of the Criminal Law Article, or 2 an offense under the laws of another state that would constitute child sexual abuse 3 under § 3–602 of the Criminal Law Article if committed in this State; or
- 4 (3) A crime of violence as defined in § 14–101 of the Criminal Law 5 Article, or an offense under the laws of another state that would be a violation of § 14–101 of the Criminal Law Article if committed in this State.
 - (b) The [Department] **STATE BOARD** shall revoke the certificate of approval or letter of tentative approval of a nonpublic school that violates this section.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 2010.
