CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Education – Nonpublic School Employees – Criminal Convictions**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Education, instead of the State
4 Department of Education, to revoke the certificate of approval or letter of
5 tentative approval of a nonpublic school that is in violation of certain provisions
6 of law relating to the employment of certain employees who have been convicted
7 of certain crimes; and generally relating to nonpublic schools.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Education**

16 2–206.1.

1 (a) A nonpublic school that is subject to the requirements of this title may
2 not hire or retain any employee who works with or has access to students and who the
3 school knows has been convicted of a crime involving:

4 (1) An offense under § 3–307 of the Criminal Law Article;

5 (2) Child sexual abuse under § 3–602 of the Criminal Law Article, or
6 an offense under the laws of another state that would constitute child sexual abuse
7 under § 3–602 of the Criminal Law Article if committed in this State; or

8 (3) A crime of violence as defined in § 14–101 of the Criminal Law
9 Article, or an offense under the laws of another state that would be a violation of
10 § 14–101 of the Criminal Law Article if committed in this State.

11 (b) The [Department] **STATE BOARD** shall revoke the certificate of approval
12 or letter of tentative approval of a nonpublic school that violates this section.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
14 October 1, 2010.
