CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Maryland Higher Education Commission – Office of Student Financial Assistance

- 4 FOR the purpose of revising and clarifying certain provisions relating to student financial assistance administered by the Office of Student Financial Assistance 5 6 in the Maryland Higher Education Commission; repealing provisions relating to 7 the enforcement of certain bonds given by scholarship recipients; authorizing 8 the Office of Student Financial Assistance to adopt rules and regulations that 9 include certain provisions; and generally relating to administration of student financial assistance by the Office of Student Financial Assistance in the 10 Maryland Higher Education Commission. 11

- 2 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 3 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 4 Article Education
- 5 18–102.
- Except as otherwise provided in this title, the provisions of this subtitle apply to any scholarship, grant, [or] loan, OR OTHER STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE awarded [under this title] BY THE OFFICE.
- 9 18–103.
- A scholarship, grant, [or] loan, OR OTHER STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE
- 11 [issued under this title] AWARDED BY THE OFFICE may be used at any public or
- 12 private institution of higher education in this State that possesses a certificate of
- approval from the [Maryland Higher Education] Commission.

- 15 (a) If, during an academic year, a student who is receiving any STUDENT 16 FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE award [under this title] withdraws from the institution at
- 17 which the award is used or otherwise fails to remain eligible for the award, the
- institution shall make a pro rata refund to the Office or other donor on the same terms
- 19 that it makes refunds to students.
- 20 (b) Any refund may be reawarded on an interim basis under this title until the end of the academic year. Any requirement of an examination is waived for the recipient of an interim award.

- 24 (a) (1) Each year, money for each [award] STUDENT FINANCIAL 25 ASSISTANCE program [under this title] ADMINISTERED BY THE OFFICE shall be included in the State budget.
- 27 (2) Each year, the Governor shall include in the State budget at least 80 percent of the funds appropriated in the prior fiscal year for need–based programs 29 as provided in §§ 18–301, 18–706(f), 18–1401, 18–1501, and 18–2601 of this title.
- 30 (b) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this title, money appropriated 31 under this title that is not used by the end of the fiscal year may not revert to the 32 State Treasury.

- 1 (2) All money retained under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall be 2 used to make awards to students during subsequent fiscal years as provided in 3 §§ 18–301, 18–601, 18–604, 18–706(f), 18–1401, 18–14A–01, 18–1501, and 18–2601 of 4 this title and may not be used for administrative expenses.

- Any college student or other individual, who is under 18 years old and is eligible for or is receiving benefits from any State scholarship, loan, tuition grant, remission of fixed charges, fellowship, [or] federal or State student loan program [under this title], OR ANY OTHER STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE:
- 10 (1) May execute notes, contracts, or agreements necessary to obtain 11 these benefits in the same manner and with the same effect as though he were 18 12 years old; and
- 13 (2) May not assert the disability of infancy as a defense in any action brought against him with respect to these benefits.

- 16 (a) The Office shall review and investigate each bond given by a recipient of a scholarship.
- 18 (b) If the Office determines that any recipient has failed or refused to comply
 19 with the conditions of the bond, the Office may refer the matter to the Attorney
 20 General, who shall do anything necessary and proper to enforce the bond.
- 21 (c) The Attorney General shall account for any money received from 22 enforcement of a bond and the money shall revert to the State Treasury.

- Any student attending a public institution of higher education who is not 24 a resident of this State and who is enrolled in an education course or program leading 2526 to an occupation as a licensed registered nurse or a licensed practical nurse shall pay 27only the tuition fees and other mandatory fees payable by a resident of this State if the 28 student furnishes a [surety bond or] promissory note to this State, with security 29 satisfactory to the [Maryland Higher Education] Commission, that, on completion of 30 the education course or program, the student will work in this State for at least 4 31 years as a licensed registered nurse or a licensed practical nurse in a hospital or 32 related institution, as defined in § 19–301 of the Health – General Article.

- As a condition of receiving [a scholarship or grant] STUDENT FINANCIAL
 35 ASSISTANCE awarded [under this title] BY THE OFFICE, each recipient shall sign a

- statement pledging to remain drug free. The Commission shall determine the contents of the drug free statement.

- 4 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this title, repayment obligations incurred by recipients of student financial assistance[, scholarships, grants, or loans] administered by the [Commission under this title] OFFICE shall be calculated at an interest rate equal to and matching the interest rate established by the United States Department of Education for the Federal Stafford Loan on the first day of July of each year, with interest not accruing prior to notification to the Commission of a recipient's graduation or termination from an institution of higher education.
- 11 (b) A recipient shall commence repayment obligations [incurred under this 12 title] upon graduation or termination from an institution of higher education.

- 14 (a) A student may [hold a scholarship and grant issued under this title along 15 with any other scholarship and grant issued under this title] **RECEIVE ONE OR MORE** 16 **AWARDS OF STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE** if:
- 17 (1) Eligibility requirements are met for each [scholarship and grant]
 18 TYPE OF STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE received; and
- 19 (2) The total of all [scholarships and grants] STUDENT FINANCIAL 20 ASSISTANCE received does not exceed:
- 21 (i) The student's total cost of education as certified by the 22 institution the student is attending; and
- 23 (ii) The equivalent annual expenses of a full-time resident 24 undergraduate at the 4-year public institution of higher education within the 25 University System of Maryland, other than the University of Maryland University 26 College and University of Maryland, Baltimore, with the highest annual expenses for 27 a full-time resident undergraduate.
 - (b) A student who [holds] RECEIVES multiple [scholarships and grants issued under this title] AWARDS OF STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE that have a service obligation requirement:
- 31 (1) Must fulfill the terms of each service obligation; and
- 32 (2) May not fulfill the service obligations concurrently.

19 20 21	(II) THE REPAYMENT OF STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FUNDS RECEIVED SHOULD A RECIPIENT FAIL TO PERFORM A SERVICE OBLIGATION; AND
22 23	(III) WAIVER AND DEFERMENT OF A SERVICE OBLIGATION OR REPAYMENT IN CIRCUMSTANCES DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION.
