BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Agriculture Section 2–310.1 Annotated Code of Maryland (2007 Replacement Volume and 2009 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Agriculture 2-310.1.
