- 4 FOR the purpose of expanding the maximum number of members of the Tidal Fisheries Advisory Commission; requiring the composition of the Tidal Fisheries $\mathbf{5}$ 6 Advisory Commission to reflect the geographic regions of the State where the $\overline{7}$ commercial fishing industry is operating; staggering the terms for the 8 membership of the Tidal Fisheries Advisory Commission and the Sport 9 Fisheries Advisory Commission; expanding the membership of the Sport Fisheries Advisory Commission; specifying the terms of the members of the 10 commissions; and generally relating to the membership of the Tidal Fisheries 11 Advisory Commission and Sport Fisheries Advisory Commissions in the 12 Department of Natural Resources. 13

At the end of a term, a member continues to serve 1 [(ii)] **(III)** $\mathbf{2}$ until a successor is appointed and qualifies. 3 (iii)] **(IV)** A member who is appointed after a term has begun 4 serves only for the rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and gualifies. $\mathbf{5}$ SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That beginning with the term 6 that began on July 22, 2009: 7the terms of five of the members of the Tidal Fisheries Advisory (1)8 Commission shall expire on June 30, 2011; and 9 (2)the terms of the remaining members shall expire on June 30, 2013. SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That: 10 beginning with the term that began on July 20, 2009: 11 (1)12the terms of six of the existing members of the Sport (i) 13Fisheries Advisory Commission shall expire on June 30, 2011; and the terms of the remaining six existing members shall expire 14(ii) on June 30, 2013; and 15the initial terms of the new members appointed in accordance with 16 (2)17§ 4–204(b)(3) of the Natural Resources Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, 18 shall expire June 30, 2013. SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That this Act shall take effect 19 20July 1, 2010.
