Education - High School Diploma - GED Options Program

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Education to establish a GED 4 Options Program that provides certain students with an alternative course for 5 obtaining a high school diploma beginning on a certain date; providing for 6 certain Program requirements; requiring students enrolled in a certain program 7 to be counted in the average daily attendance of a certain school system; 8 requiring the State Board to adopt certain regulations; and generally relating to 9 the GED Options Program for obtaining a high school diploma.

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 22Article - Education
- 23 7-206.
- 24BEGINNING AUGUST 1, 2010, THE STATE BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH (A)
- 25 A GED OPTIONS PROGRAM THAT PROVIDES STUDENTS AT RISK OF DROPPING

- 1 OUT OF HIGH SCHOOL WITH AN ALTERNATIVE COURSE FOR OBTAINING A HIGH
- 2 SCHOOL DIPLOMA.
- 3 (B) THE PROGRAM REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS 4 SECTION SHALL:
- 5 (1) INCLUDE ONLY STUDENTS WHO ARE BETWEEN 16 AND 18 YEARS OF AGE WHO ARE DETERMINED TO BE AT HIGH RISK OF DROPPING OUT OF HIGH SCHOOL;
- 8 (2) REQUIRE MANDATORY ENROLLMENT AND ATTENDANCE IN A
 9 GENERAL EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT PREPARATORY PROGRAM FOR AT
 10 LEAST 15 HOURS EACH WEEK IN A PLACE AND MANNER APPROVED BY THE
 11 APPROPRIATE SCHOOL AUTHORITY;
- 12 (3) PROVIDE TRAINING IN WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT SKILLS; 13 AND
- 14 (4) DETERMINE PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS TO BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE COMPULSORY ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS UNDER § 7–301 OF THIS 16 TITLE.
- 17 (C) STUDENTS ENROLLED IN THE GED OPTIONS PROGRAM UNDER 18 THIS SECTION SHALL BE COUNTED IN THE AVERAGE DAILY ATTENDANCE OF 19 THE LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM.
- 20 (D) THE STATE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT 21 THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.

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- 23 (a) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, each child who resides in this State and is 5 years old or older and under 16 shall attend a public school regularly during the entire school year unless the child is otherwise receiving regular, thorough instruction during the school year in the studies usually taught in the public schools to children of the same age.
 - (2) In accordance with regulations of the State Board of Education, a child who resides in this State and is 5 years old may be exempted from mandatory school attendance for 1 year if the child's parent or guardian files a written request with the local school system asking that the child's attendance be delayed due to the child's level of maturity.
- 33 (3) Except as provided in subsection (f) of this section or in regulations 34 of the State Board of Education, each child who resides in this State shall attend a

- kindergarten program regularly during the school year prior to entering the first grade unless the child is otherwise receiving regular, thorough instruction in the skills and studies usually taught in a kindergarten program of a public school.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 July 1, 2010.
