Procurement – Minority Business Enterprises – Reciprocal Certification
<u>Process</u>

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Board of Public Works to adopt regulations to $\mathbf{5}$ recognize and accommodate, for the purpose of certification under the State 6 minority business enterprise program, minority business enterprises that $\overline{7}$ receive promote and facilitate certification under the State's minority business 8 enterprise program of minority business enterprises that have received 9 certification from a certain federal agency or from a county government in the State that uses a qualification process substantially similar to the State's 10 11 certification process; requiring the Board to keep certain records and submit a 12 certain annual report to the General Assembly about the certification of certain 13minority business enterprises; and generally relating to a reciprocal 14certification process for certain minority business enterprises.

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

3 (a) (1) (i) In accordance with Title 10, Subtitle 1 of the State 4 Government Article, the Board shall adopt regulations consistent with the purposes of 5 this Division II to carry out the requirements of this subtitle.

6 (ii) The Board shall keep a record of the number of waivers 7 requested and the number of waivers granted each year under subsection (b)(8) of this 8 section and submit a copy of the record to the General Assembly on or before October 1 9 of each year, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article.

10 (III) THE BOARD SHALL KEEP A RECORD OF THE AGGREGATE NUMBER AND THE IDENTITY OF MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISES 11 12THAT RECEIVE **CERTIFICATION** UNDER THE RECIPROCAL PROCESS 13ESTABLISHED BY THE BOARD UNDER SUBSECTION (B)(1) OF THIS SECTION AND SUBMIT A COPY OF THE RECORD TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON OR BEFORE 14OCTOBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE 15**GOVERNMENT ARTICLE.** 16

- 17 (2) The regulations shall establish procedures to be followed by units, 18 prospective contractors, and successful bidders or offerors to maximize notice to, and 19 the opportunity to participate in the procurement process by, a broad range of 20 minority business enterprises.
- 21 (b) These regulations shall include:

(1) (I) provisions designating one STATE agency to certify and decertify minority business enterprises for all units through a single process that meets applicable federal requirements; AND

1 (13) a requirement that a bid or proposal based on a solicitation with an 2 expected degree of minority business enterprise participation identify the specific 3 commitment of certified minority business enterprises at the time of submission;

4 (14) provisions promoting and providing for the counting and reporting 5 of certified minority business enterprises as prime contractors; and

6 (15) other provisions that the Board considers necessary or appropriate 7 to encourage participation by minority business enterprises and to protect the 8 integrity of the procurement process.

9 (c) The regulations adopted under this section shall specify that a unit may 10 not allow a business to participate as if it were a certified minority business enterprise 11 if the business's certification is pending.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2010.
