22	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
23	MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Except for a special election to fill a vacancy, an election for the office of United States Senator shall be held:

- 3 (1) in 1998 and every sixth year thereafter; and
- 4 (2) in 2000 and every sixth year thereafter.
- 5 8–602.

- 6 (a) (1) [If] SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPHS (2) AND (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION, IF there is a vacancy in the office of United States Senator, the Governor shall [appoint an eligible individual to fill the vacancy.
- 9 (2) Except as provided in paragraph (3) of this subsection, the appointed individual shall serve until a successor is elected pursuant to subsection (b) of this section to fill the remainder of the term.
- 12 (3) The appointed individual shall serve for the remainder of the term
 13 if the vacancy occurs after the date that is 21 days before the deadline for filing
 14 certificates of candidacy for the election that is held in the fourth year of the term] BY
 15 PROCLAMATION CALL A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON A DATE THAT IS NOT
 16 LESS THAN 90 DAYS BUT NOT MORE THAN 160 DAYS AFTER THE DATE THE
 17 VACANCY OCCURS.
 - (2) IF THE VACANCY OCCURS ON A DATE THAT IS NOT LESS THAN 90 DAYS BUT NOT MORE THAN 160 DAYS BEFORE THE DATE OF THE PRIMARY ELECTION FOR THAT OFFICE, THE GOVERNOR SHALL BY PROCLAMATION CALL THE SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE DATE OF THE PRIMARY ELECTION.
 - (3) IF THE VACANCY OCCURS ON A DATE THAT IS LESS THAN 90 DAYS BEFORE OR IS ON OR AFTER THE DATE OF THE PRIMARY ELECTION IN THE YEAR IN WHICH A CANDIDATE TO FILL THE OFFICE IS REGULARLY ELECTED, THE GOVERNOR MAY NOT CALL A SPECIAL ELECTION.
 - (b) [If the vacancy occurs before the date that is 21 days before the deadline for filing certificates of candidacy for the next succeeding regular statewide election, the Governor shall issue a proclamation immediately after the occurrence of the vacancy declaring that a special primary election and a special general election shall be held at the same time as the next regular statewide primary election and regular statewide general election] IF THERE IS A VACANCY IN THE OFFICE OF UNITED STATES SENATOR, THE GOVERNOR MAY APPOINT, AT LEAST 5 DAYS BUT NOT LATER THAN 30 DAYS AFTER THE DATE OF THE VACANCY, A QUALIFIED INDIVIDUAL TO FILL THE VACANCY TEMPORARILY UNTIL THE RESULTS OF ANY SPECIAL ELECTION CALLED TO FILL THE VACANCY ARE CERTIFIED.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply to any vacancy in the office of United States Senator that occurs on or after the commencement of the term of the Governor who is sworn in on January 21, 2015, and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or application to any vacancy in the office of United States Senator that occurs before that date.

6 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2010.
