 9 REPRESENT PARTICIPATION OF A SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN

 11 RETAIN A BID PREFERENCE OR A PROCUREMENT CONTRACT;
- 12 (3) WILLFULLY AND KNOWINGLY MAKE OR SUBSCRIBE TO ANY
 13 STATEMENT, DECLARATION, OR OTHER DOCUMENT THAT IS FRAUDULENT OR
 14 FALSE AS TO ANY MATERIAL MATTER, WHETHER OR NOT THAT FALSITY OR
 15 FRAUD IS COMMITTED WITH THE KNOWLEDGE OR CONSENT OF THE PERSON
 16 AUTHORIZED OR REQUIRED TO PRESENT THE DECLARATION, STATEMENT, OR
 17 DOCUMENT;
- WILLFULLY AND KNOWINGLY AID, ASSIST IN, PROCURE, 18 **(4)** 19 COUNSEL. OR ADVISE THE PREPARATION OR PRESENTATION OF 20 DECLARATION, STATEMENT, OR OTHER DOCUMENT THAT IS FRAUDULENT OR 21FALSE AS TO ANY MATERIAL MATTER, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THAT FALSITY 22 OR FRAUD IS COMMITTED WITH THE KNOWLEDGE OR CONSENT OF THE PERSON 23AUTHORIZED OR REQUIRED TO PRESENT THE DECLARATION, STATEMENT, OR 24DOCUMENT;
- 25 (5) WILLFULLY AND KNOWINGLY FAIL TO FILE ANY DECLARATION 26 OR NOTICE WITH THE UNIT THAT IS REQUIRED BY THIS SUBTITLE; OR
- 27 (6) ESTABLISH, KNOWINGLY AID IN THE ESTABLISHMENT OF, OR 28 EXERCISE CONTROL OVER A BUSINESS FOUND TO HAVE VIOLATED A PROVISION 29 OF ITEMS (1) THROUGH (5) OF THIS SUBSECTION.
- 30 (B) (1) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY OF THE PROVISIONS OF
 31 SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND
 32 ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000 OR
 33 IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 6 MONTHS OR BOTH.

- 1 (2) IN ADDITION TO THE PENALTIES UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY OF THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE:
- 4 (I) FOR THE FIRST OFFENSE, LIABLE FOR A CIVIL PENALTY 5 OF NOT LESS THAN \$10,000 AND NOT EXCEEDING \$30,000; AND
- 6 (II) FOR A SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE, LIABLE FOR A CIVIL 7 PENALTY OF NOT LESS THAN \$30,000 AND NOT EXCEEDING \$50,000.

- 12 (C) THE BOARD SHALL PROHIBIT A BUSINESS OR PERSON WHO FAILS
