- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the <del>Department of Human Resources</del> State Department 4 of Education to adopt regulations that provide for an announced inspection by 5 the Department of each registered family day care home prior to issuance of a 6 continuing registration; requiring the Department to inspect each child care 7 center on an announced basis prior to issuing a continuing license or letter of 8 compliance; repealing a requirement that the Department inspect on an 9 announced basis certain family day care homes and child care centers at certain 10 intervals; repealing a requirement that an inspection by the Department of 11 certain family day care homes and child care centers include a determination of 12 whether certain record keeping requirements are being met; and generally

10 11 12 13	(1) on an announced basis prior to issuing the INITIAL OF CONTINUING license or letter of compliance [and at least every 2 years thereafter] to determine whether applicable requirements[, including record keeping requirements are being met; and
14 15 16	(2) on an unannounced basis at least once during each 12-mont period that the license or letter of compliance is in effect to determine whether saf and appropriate child care is being provided.
