Vehicle Laws – Reckless and Negligent Driving – Penalties for Death or Serious Bodily Injury

- 4 FOR the purpose of establishing that if a person violates a certain provision of law 5 relating to reckless and negligent driving and the violation contributes to an 6 accident that results in the death or the serious bodily injury of another, the 7 person is subject to a certain fine and the Motor Vehicle Administration is 8 authorized to suspend the person's license for a certain period of time; providing 9 that a licensee may request a hearing on a license suspension imposed under this Act; and generally relating to penalties for reckless and negligent driving 10 11 that contributes to an accident that results in death or serious bodily injury.

18	(1) The person is subject to a fine of not more than \$1,000; and
