## A BILL ENTITLED

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- 3 FOR the purpose of clarifying that a certain type of school vehicle used by certain 4 schools, camps, day nurseries, or day care centers to transport children is not 5 required to be equipped with seat belts and is not subject to certain regulations; 6 establishing that a motor vehicle that formerly was registered as a certain type 7 of school vehicle is not required to be equipped with seat belts and is not subject 8 to certain regulations if it is used by certain schools, camps, day nurseries, or 9 day care centers to transport children; and generally relating to seat belts on 10 school buses.

- (b) "Type I school vehicle" does not include any bus operated by a common carrier under the jurisdiction of a State, regional, or federal regulatory agency or operated by the agency itself.

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Every motor vehicle that is used by nursery schools, camps, day nurseries, or day care centers for children with an intellectual disability to transport children [and that is not regulated as a "school bus" under this article,] shall be equipped with seat belts for each seat and shall be subject to any other regulations adopted by the Administration, UNLESS THE MOTOR VEHICLE:

- (1) IS A TYPE I SCHOOL VEHICLE; OR
- 13 (2) WAS FORMERLY REGISTERED AS A TYPE I SCHOOL VEHICLE.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2010.
