1 AN ACT concerning

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Education - Maryland Longitudinal Data System

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Longitudinal Data System as a 4 statewide data system containing certain student data from all levels of 5 education and into the State's workforce; establishing the purpose of the 6 Maryland Longitudinal Data System; establishing the Maryland Longitudinal 7 Data System Center as an independent unit of State government; providing for 8 the organizational placement, location, staffing, and funding of the Center; providing for the functions and duties of the Center; establishing the Governing 9 10 Board of the Maryland Longitudinal Data System Center; providing for the membership of the Governing Board; providing for the appointment and terms 11 12 for certain members of the Governing Board; providing for the duties of the 13 Governing Board; requiring certain agencies and public institutions to make certain efforts to comply with certain requirements for the Maryland 14 15 Longitudinal Data System; authorizing private institutions of higher education 16 and private secondary schools to provide student data for the Maryland 17 Longitudinal Data System; requiring the Governing Board to issue certain reports; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the establishment of 18 19 the Maryland Longitudinal Data System.
